


## LANGSTONE HARBOUR LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS NO. 07 OF 2021

## DEPOSIT OF OYSTER CULTCH IN RUSSELLS LAKE

Mariners are advised that the Blue Marine Foundation, will be laying cultch (a layer of mixed shell and gravel) in Russells Lake from Wednesday 15 September 2021. Works are dependent upon weather conditions but once commenced are expected to take a maximum of 10 days. Works will take place using a 20m LOA hopper barge manoeuvred with a tug. Approximately 265 tonnes of culch will be deposited in a layer no deeper than 15cm in the vicinity of the following co-ordinates:

50° 49.112'N, 001° 1.235'W, 50° 49.112'N, 001° 1.227'W (see chartlet below).



The cultch is being deposited as part of the Solent Oyster Restoration Project to recover the condition of surface sediments and create preferable oyster habitat.

Following deposition of the cultch, surveying and any necessary ploughing works will be undertaken which may take an additional 2 days. Mariners are advised to keep clear from of all work boats operating in Russells Lake for the duration of the works.

Owners, Agents, Charterers, Marinas, Yacht Clubs and Recreational Sailing Organisations should ensure that the contents of this Notice are made known to the Masters or persons in charge of their vessels or craft.
